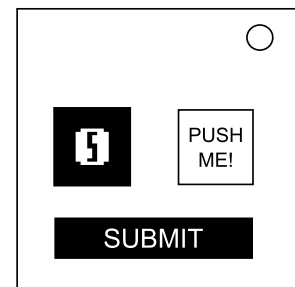


## On the Subject of Backgrounds

RULE	ROW	COLUMN
Backing Color = Button Color	A	C
Button OR Backing = <b>BLACK</b> OR <b>WHITE</b>	D	B
No D Batteries	C	E
No AA Batteries	D	D
Button AND Backing = <b>RED</b> OR <b>YELLOW</b> OR <b>BLUE</b>	B	F
Button = <b>ORANGE</b> OR <b>GREEN</b> OR <b>PURPLE</b>	F	E
Unlit SND Indicator	E	B
Serial Port	B	C
Backing Color + <b>BLUE</b> = Button Color*	C	D
Otherwise	E	A

Mixing Red and Yellow will make Orange, Blue and Yellow will make Green, and Red and Blue will make Purple. Mixing Blue and White will **not** make Blue.
